President's Corner

When I took over as president in July of 2003, FY03, I had a goal of increasing member participation. While we had almost 100 members we had difficulty filling board and committee positions. Many of our active members had split off to form the DelMar peninsula section, leaving the volunteers we did have overwhelmed with multiple committee positions. We also had low turnout for monthly meetings. Meeting participation at the time was 5-10 members, 5-10% of our membership. At the FY05 planning meeting, the board set a lofty goal of 75% participation, in at least 1 activity. While we have not met that goal, I am extremely happy with the progress we have made in the last few years. We now are getting 15-30 participants at our meetings, we have all but two committee positions filled, many of them with "new faces", and we have an active group planning the Region E conference!

Now that we have additional members participating in monthly meetings I'm finding that many members do not know about some of our other activities. I get frequent questions or comments asking what certain committees do or what some of the activities entail. Last newsletter I started a section describing a couple of committees. I will continue that section each month with 2-3 of the committees at a time. I will also start a section which will describe an activity that the section does. If at any time you see a committee or activity you are interested in please contact the committee chair or myself.

Finally the December meeting is a holiday social on December 8th at On the Board at the Neshaminy Mall. Take a break from the holiday season to relax and network with your fellow SWE members. In January there will be two meetings. The monthly meeting will be a professional development topic held on January 9th. This meeting is still being planned so look for more information to come. In addition we will have a joint meeting with ISA on January 18th.

Activity Highlights

Future City 2006

Teams of 7th and 8th graders from schools within the Philadelphia Region participate in this competition each year. The competition includes designing a city of the future, building a working model of a portion of their city, writing an essay about city planning and design issues, and verbally presenting their city design to a panel of judges from the engineering, planning, and architectural communities. While this is not a SWE only event, our section participates by providing a SWE "Quality of Life" award. Jen Wetzel coordinates the volunteers and each year our members volunteer to judge various portions of the event. This year's Future City event will be held on January 28th.

SWE-Widener Engineering Mini-Camp

Each year high school girls are able to experience 4 of 10 different engineering workshops at the Annual SWE-Widener University Engineering Mini-Camp for High School Girls. There is also a parent portion. This year the mini-camp will be held at Widener on February 11, 2006. Participants in this event included high school girls, parents, and volunteers representing undergraduate and graduate engineering students, engineers, and engineering professors from a range of engineering disciplines. Vicki Brown, Widener Civil Engineering Department Chair, organizes and coordinates each of the camps. Many of our members volunteer to assist with the workshops.
