Neha Thomas and Savannah Lee submitted a poster together and won 1st place in the National SWE Technical Poster Competition. Three Drexel students participated in the SME bowl: Samantha Cassel, Melissa Dubois, Jennier Lui (from Binghamton, NY), and Anna Lu pulled together a last minute team and won 4th at SME bowl. Sam Schneider, Drexel Secretary, said that her biggest takeaway was learning that "leadership is about seeing potential in others and motivating them to accomplish great things."

Boeing Chinook Tour

6:30 PM November 6, 2013

Nearly 40 attendees from SWE Philadelphia and local collegiate sections joined us for a tour of the Boeing facility in Ridley Park, PA where Chinook helicopters are manufactured. The Chinook is a multi-mission, heavy-lift transport helicopter whose primary mission is to move troops, artillery, ammunition, fuel, water, and other supplies on the battlefield. Chinooks also help with medical evacuation, disaster relief, and search and rescue. Attendees were able to see these impressive aircraft in various stages of production and learn about the lean manufacturing practices at the Boeing facility. Special thanks to Vicki Sholtes for her help in organizing this event!
