Our members are getting ready for the National Convention in Albuquerque. The Region E Section Meeting in Rochester was attended by Susan Best and Cindy Potter. Ronna Robertson will be the Region E Director for the next two years.

Elections for next year's officers are now being held. Return your ballot before June 3rd. You must sign the outside flap of the envelope to validate the ballot. Winners will be announced before National Convention in June.

The Awards Banquet was held on April 23rd at the Radnor Hotel. Five thousand dollars in scholarship money was awarded to students from the University of Pennsylvania, Villanova University, Drexel University, and Swarthmore. A five hundred dollar Science Fair scholarship was given to Pennridge Central High School senior, Katrina Krulla. A total of 22 attended the banquet. Representatives from PECO Energy, American Water Works, Lockheed Martin Management and Data Systems, Raytheon Engineers and Constructors, and Delmarva Power joined us to present scholarships and honor the winners. Awards were also given to Section Officers and Committee Chairs for their contribution during the past year.

The Industry Reception with the Society of Women Engineers Board of Directors was hosted by the Philadelphia Section on April 30th. The meeting was well attended with section members and industry representatives. Discussions centered around the role of SWE in serving industry and the community as well as its members.
