The panelists advised the students on how to handle various situations that may be encountered in the office, in the field, or during business travel. Additional dialog among the students, panelists, and Widener Student Advisor Vicki Brown continued during dinner.

Philadelphia Section Charter Member Alma Kuppinger Forman gave a one-woman skit on the origins of SWE at the 50th Anniversary Celebration and Awards Banquet held on April 18th. SWE Philadelphia Scholarship Awards

The recipients of the Philadelphia Section scholarship awards were honored at the SWE 50th Anniversary Celebration and Awards Banquet held on April 18. This year five scholarships, each valued at \$1000, were awarded to engineering students currently enrolled at local colleges. Each student was judged based on evaluation of the following items submitted in the application:

- A description of extracurricular activities with emphasis on any leadership roles she undertook;
- · An essay about why she is studying engineering;
- · A copy of her transcript;
- A recommendation from a Professor or teaching assistant with whom she has worked.

The FY'00 Philadelphia Section Scholarship Awards include three named awards (individual sponsor) and two Section awards (multiple corporate and member sponsors). This year's recipients are:

Anastasia Venable: Verizon Wireless Scholarship

Anastasia is a Senior majoring in Chemical Engineering at Widener University. She is President of the Widener SWE Student Section, a member of the American Institute of Chemical Engineers, Widener University's Engineering Council, and the Student Advisory Board for Career Advising and Planning Services. She has also served as an upper-class mentor for freshman engineering students.

Anastasia was group leader for her senior project, "The Manufacture of Collagen Microspheres for Culture of Stem Cells". She was named to the national Dean's List and to "Who's Who Among American Colleges and Universities." She is a member of Phi Theta Kappa, Phi Kappa Phi, Alpha Chi, Tau Beta Pi (National Engineering Honor Society), and is Vice President of Omega Chi Epsilon (National Chemical Engineering Honor Society).

One of her professors describes Anastasia as an extraordinary person and a good leader with exemplary character. He feels she has enormous potential to complete a vast body of work in her lifetime.

Sonia Stewart: Alice Stoll Scholarship

Sonia is a Senior majoring in Chemical Engineering at Widener University. She is Vice President of the SWE Student Section at Widener and has served as the Section's Student Government Association representative. Sonia is also involved in the National Society of Black Engineers and the American Institute of Chemical Engineers where she served as Student Government Association representative. She is a member of Tau Beta Pi (National Engineering Honor Society) and President of Omega Chi Epsilon (National Chemical Engineering Honor Society).

Sonia would like to make a major contribution to science and engineering that may help people all over the world.

One of her professors feels that she has great potential in Chemical Engineering; she is quick with complicated topics, is a good leader, and is very organized.

Donna Stauffer: Merck & Co. Scholarship

Donna is a Sophomore majoring in Chemical Engineering at Widener University. In addition to SWE, Donna is involved in the American Chemical Society, Biology Society/Environ-mental Club, Alpha Chi, Tau Beta Pi (National Engineering Honor Society), and is incoming president for the American Institute of Chemical Engineers. Donna is currently a research assistant in charge of collagen production process.

Donna was originally drawn to engineering because she wanted to make a difference in the world. She is very interested in the environment, especially the pollution problem. In a letter of recommendation one of her professors states: "Widener is fortunate to have a student like Donna. She should go quite far."

Shahin Merchant: Philadelphia Section Scholarship

Shahin is a Junior majoring in Computer Science and Engineering with minors in Economics and Mathematics at the University of Pennsylvania. She became involved in SWE during her Freshman year, which she spent at Cornell University. Shanin's long list of activities includes many positions of leadership. She was Mentorship Chair for the Association of Computer Science Undergraduates, Publicity Chair for the Cornell Business Society, and List Manager for the Society for India. Shahin is currently the Director of Alumni Relations for Penn's SWE Student Section, Publicity Chair for DP, Penn s student chapter of the Association for Computing Machinery, a peer advisor for EPAC, the Engineering Peer Advisory Council and a teaching assistant for the Department of Computer and Information Science.

One of her professors states that "Shahin is the best undergraduate in the current CSE junior class. Her class rank is #1 out of 125 students." He calls her a "brilliant student" and believes that she is a person who will make an important difference.
