Tessa Anodide, Secretary



1. What do you do at work?

I am a Program Manager at Lockheed Martin MST in Moorestown, NJ. I am currently leading Sea Based Terminal (SBT) Increment 2, a Ballistic Missile Defense Program focused on BM engagements in the terminal phase of flight. This experience has truly allowed me to focus on Systems Engineering from Concept Development through System Design and will take me all the way through certification. In addition to my PM responsibilities, I am the lead for all Diversity & Inclusion activities at the Moorestown site including interfacing with the Employee Resource Groups and Employee Networks.

2. What is the most interesting project you have worked on?

The most interesting project I've worked on was in 2011. It was a quick turn proof of concept demonstration of Diurnal Star Tracker at a flight test in Kauai, HI. The normal timeframe to

get ready for a flight test involves preparations lasting 6-9 months; our team had just 3 months to generate the pre-mission readiness efforts. Of course, two weeks of work in Kauai, HI was a perk to this intense effort:) That was the first time that I had to leave my son (1 at the time) for an extended duration. We became experts at FaceTime over that two week period!

3. What is the best SWE event you've been to?

The best SWE event I've been to was the Societal Conference in Kansas City, MO in 2006. I joined SWE earlier that year and was excited to have company sponsorship to attend the event. I was completely amazed by the camaraderie, energy and excitement that surrounded the conference and knew that SWE was an organization that would play a key role in my future!

4. What are your hobbies?

As much as I'm an extrovert, a lot of my hobbies are solitary activities which I found puzzling until recently. I realized that I love to create and that is a key theme in my work life and my home life. I knit and crochet and have about 15 projects started (no joke!). A few years ago I started to learn to sew/quilt and really enjoy it - it's a nice application of my mathematical skills. I also love to read and cook - I try to balance my reading with leadership books and fiction. I loved the Hunger Games series! In addition, I started my college career out as music major so when I find the time, I love to sit and play the piano.

5. What is one goal you are currently trying to achieve?

A few years ago, I wrote a children's book and I'm trying to get it published. (That's been on my bucket list ever since High School). There is a TON of information about finding an agent, going with a publisher or self publishing. I am currently filtering through the information so I can make the best decision and am working with an illustrator. It's exciting, but overwhelming at times, too.

6. Who do you admire most?

Without a shadow of a doubt, that has to be my Grandmother. I was born on her birthday and we always shared a close bond. She had a love of music and reading which she instilled in me and was a very motivational woman. Before she passed away, she gave me a book of poems, and throughout the book, she wrote special notes to me about life. The book is sitting on my nightstand and I read it often. She always told me that I could be anything I wanted. She balanced that by saying it wouldn't be easy and that I would have to work hard, but that anything I put my mind to was achievable.

Delaware Valley Science Fair - April 2

Philadelphia SWE sent judges to the Delaware Valley Science Fair to judge winners from recent local fairs. SWE gave out 30 awards to some very bright young women. Projects ranged from creating more efficient biofuels to developing a viable tooth enamel replacement. There were 1032 projects at the fair and over 1000 award were given worth approximately 3 million dollars!

Isabelle Frances French

February 16, 1924-March 1, 2014

Isabelle French, 90, of Everett, WA passed away peacefully, March 1, 2014, surrounded by family. She was born February 16, 1924 to Grace Benton Seward and Abram French in Swampscott, MA. She graduated from Swampscott High School in 1941, and from Tri-State College in Angola, Indiana with a B.S. in Radio Engineering in 1944. As a pioneer for women in the field of engineering, her distinguished career included working for Sylvania Electric Products (1944-1952), Capehart-Farnsworth (1952-1954), Bell Telephone Laboratories from 1954-1987. Isabelle's greatest passion was encouraging young women in the field of engineering. She was a charter member of Society of Women Engineers (SWE), joining in 1951, and holding a number of national offices. She gave the commencement address to the graduating engineers at the University of Utah in June of 1965. She was awarded an honorary doctorate in engineering from Tri-State University in 1966. Isabelle was a gentle and caring soul, giving generously of her time and talents. A generous philanthropist, she was an active member of the women-only service club, Altrusa Club of Allentown, PA from 1963-1990. Civic-minded, she was appointed to the East Allen Township (PA) Planning Commission in 1962, and was chosen as chairperson in the 1970's. She served as a Township Supervisor from 1982-1989. She was creative and adventuresome. In her retirement, Isabelle started her own business, "Shape & Fix," building custom cabinets, bases, countertops and restoring furniture, with a focus on residential and business remodeling (1987-1992). In 1992 she ventured to the Pacific Northwest, moving to Clinton, Whidbey Island, WA, in March of 1995, where she resided for over 13 years with her Shetland Sheepdogs, Marco Polo, and later, Sparky. She became involved in the community as a math tutor at South Whidbey Intermediate School, and with the Clinton Friends of the Library. Sunrise Villa Independent Living in Everett, WA was home from 2008 until her passing in 2014. Isabelle was preceded in death by her parents, her brother-in-law, Sieg Kiemle, and many dear friends. Survivors include her sister, Ruth Kiemle, 2 nieces, Anne Kiemle (Kael Sherrard), Elizabeth Thoreson (Jeff), one nephew, Fritz Kiemle (Heidi), and 8 great nieces and nephews, Kalan Sherrard; Sky (Amy), Anders, Sigrid, Kaia, and Hans Thoreson; Dietrich and Ailsa Kiemle.
